

Gas and solvent use and the Law

Under the 2016 Psychoactive Substances Act, it is illegal to sell or supply psychoactive substances. This includes butane gas, solvents and aerosols if the seller has reason to believe that they will be used for intoxication (i.e. to get 'high'). This legislation includes sales to adults and young people and you could be prosecuted.



There is also specific legislation controlling the sale of some gases and solvents to young people. This includes the following:

- It is illegal to supply cigarette lighter refills containing butane to anyone under the age of 18 (Cigarette Lighter Refill (Safety) Regulations, 1999)
- It is illegal to sell spray paint to anyone under the age of 16 (Antisocial Behaviour Act, 2003)
- Under national licensing regulations, petrol cannot be sold to anyone under the age of 16.
